Section 2- Role of the ABS C-H

Subsections: A – I

- A: Relationship of the ABS C-H with the Convention's Clearing house:
 - Identifies the COP decision requirements and processes
 - makes it clear that the ABS-CH is part of the CBD CH
 - CBD CoP gives the ABS-CH five key characteristics
 - CBD Dec X/15 sets out broader role of the CBD CH over the next 10 years



Subsection B – Information sharing obligations

Protocol Article 14, Parties obliged to provide information on:

- ABS legislative, policy and admin measures
- National focal points and national competent authorities (and respective responsibilities)
- Permits as evidence of PIC and MAT
- ILC Competent Authorities, model clauses and best practices and codes of conduct



Subsection B – Information sharing obligations and opportunities

- Other information:
 - TK: Information on development of ILC requirements for MAT, Community Protocols and model clauses (Art 12)
 - awareness raising of ILC ABS TK initiatives and user obligations (Art 21)
 - Information collected by checkpoints (Art 17(a))
 - capacity building initiatives (Art 22)



Subsection C – Internationally Recognised Certificates of Compliance

- A Key function of the C-H
- Provides evidence of legal certainty and refutes ‘biopiracy’ allegations
- ABS C-H operationalises this initiative
- Article 17 establishes minimum information to be reported and disclosed by the ABS C-H
- Certificates of Compliance are evidence of PIC and MAT



Subsection D – More detail on possible additional information

- Governing Body Decisions
- Tools developed by ILCs
- Role in Awareness raising of, tools, obligations and opportunities
- Promulgation of Standards and Best Practice Guidelines, Codes of Conduct



Subsection E - Confidentiality

- ABS C-H **NOT** a source of confidential information



Subsection F –Traditional Knowledge

- ABS C-M informs users of obligations to TK holders
- Opportunity for ILCs holding TK related to Genetic Resources to decide on level of detail of process and procedures for access to TK and sharing benefits to be passed to the ABS C-H



Subsection G – Monitoring and Tracking

- Value of the Certificates in monitoring and tracking use of GRs
- Role of ‘due diligence’
- Provision of legal certainty
- Risk management
- Evidence of good faith action



Subsection H – Amending Certificates – increasing their utility

- Explains issue
- Identifies benefits
- Deals with unidentified species issue
- Disclosure of permit obligations met
- Disclosure of MAT obligations met
- Value to regulators in 3rd countries
- Flexibility at design stage



Subsection I – Contribution of non-Parties

- Consistent with Art 24 non-Parties may contribute information to the ABS C-H as much as if they were Parties and should be encouraged to do so.

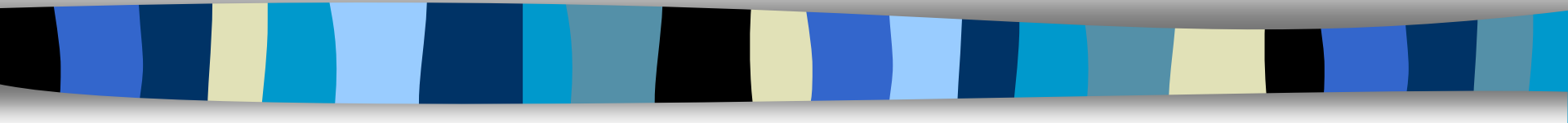

Information to support implementation

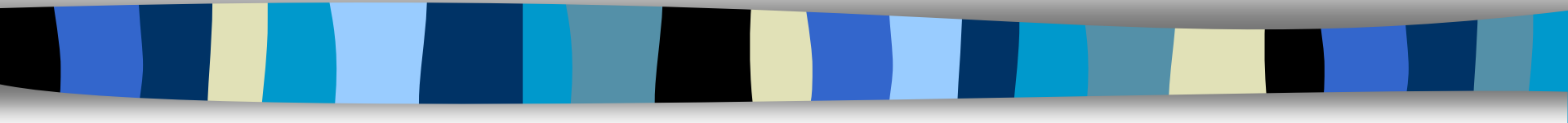
