## PROVISIONAL AGENDA AND PROGRAMME OF WORK

## **BACKGROUND**

- 1. The Friends of the CBD workshop, to be hosted with the generous support of the Government of Switzerland, provides an ideal opportunity for open, meaningful dialogue in an informal setting among experts from governments and other partners around possible approaches to enhance review of implementation.
- 2. The purpose of the dialogue workshop is to explore, strengthen understanding and contribute ideas and options regarding the ways to enhance the mechanisms for the review of implementation of the Aichi Targets and the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-20120. The overall question for discussions at the workshop will be: "What existing or new mechanisms under the Convention could be used to strengthen implementation of the Convention by enhancing review?"
- 3. The workshop will not draft formal recommendations, but rather seek to enhance understanding among participants with a view to an enriched participation by Parties in the forthcoming first meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (SBI) in May in Montreal, Canada. The main outcome will be a report compiling views and perspectives of the participants to facilitate subsequent discussions at SBI and afterwards. The report of the meeting will be made available as an information note for SBI.
- 4. A professional facilitator will moderate the panels and guide participants through a series of structured group work exercises to ensure that there are meaningful, targeted discussions that build up knowledge and awareness, and an in-depth analysis of the issues surrounding a multi-dimensional review system under the Convention. Participants will learn about existing and new processes within other international processes and will have the chance to critically analyse which elements may be useful and applicable. Participants are expected to be well informed about the processes that are being implemented within their own countries to contribute to global and national reviews of implementation of the Aichi Targets and the global and the NBSAPs. Participants are expected to have reviewed the following documents in order to fully participate in the discussions.
