- Article 6 -General Measures for Conservation and Sustainable Use:
- o Develop national strategies, plans or programmes or adapt existing strategies, plans or programmes
- o Integrate biological diversity into relevant sectoral or cross-sectoral plans, programmes and policies.
- Article 26 (reports), Article 10(a) (integration into decision-making)- closely linked to Article 6
