




Initial National CHM Workshop March 2010

Objectives:

- training key stakeholders to serve as 'contributors' via the Naaya Content Management Software
- To sensitize agencies and organisations in Guyana's natural resources management sector about the purpose and functioning of the CHM.
- To identifying the types of information that can be contributed to the CHM from their respective agencies and organisations.

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Challenges

- (1) Institutional Structure
- By taking on the responsibility of acquiring/reviewing/uploading information to CHM
- (2) Level of awareness and commitment
- not promoted well
- (3) Inter-institutional coordination & cooperation
- no flow of information. As reports and other relevant documents are produced they are not forwarded to the EPA for uploading to National CHM.

Actions for consideration

- Roles of Contributor, Validator and Administrator
- Improving the quantity and quality of information that can be found on the CHM. Also providing hyperlinks on all MNRE's sector agencies websites.
- Matters related to Guyana's National CHM to be on the agenda of Ministry's meetings (both within sector and cross-sector)

CHM & implementation of NBSAP

- 1) Allows of sharing of information across the board
- 2) Networking opportunities to meet targets
- Tracking Guyana's progress in implementation and highlighting milestones achieved.

Cooperation and Support

- 1) Better cooperation among the natural resources and environment sectors within Guyana.
- 2) Access to financial aid to increase stakeholder understanding and promote greater cooperation (continuity)

3) Sharing experiences with other countries (challenges). Improve regional networking.
