| The Jamaica CHM is fully operational with a good website. However, future expansion will be limited by understaffing of the Jamaica CHM which is in need of a second full-time Information Officer. The reliance on the NHMJ budget allocation shared with 4 other departments and on project grants means that funding availability is also another critical factor that will influence the CHM programme. Some of these challenges have been occasionally alleviated through partnerships and collaborations. |

Comments on roadmap

The IAS database priority is currently being addressed. The Jamaica CHM has been asked in Jamaica's draft Aichi Biodiversity Targets to coordinate the IAS database management. The repatriation of information priority activities have started. A project proposal was previously written to acquire funding for IAS metadatabase training including Dublin Core. Funding is still being sought for the project.

Cooperation opportunities / Type of support needed

COOPERATION: Sharing of experiences with WordPress and other open source technologies; sharing of different information exchange mechanisms in the Caribbean.
Further assistance from SCBD for Caribbean countries in identifying options for web hosting and accessing additional web space.
SUPPORT NEEDED: More regional workshops and half-yearly online forum for Caribbean CHM capacity building.
