

5. General information on access to Linhares, Brazil



Linhares is located in the state of Espirito Santo in the south east of the country north of Rio de Janeiro. The closest airport is in Vitoria - Eurico de Aguiar Salles (about 100 kms from Linhares).

All participants will be met at the airport according to flight arrivals in Vitoria and will be provided transfer to the meeting venue or hotel (information will be provided shortly).

6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed below <u>do not</u> require an entry visa for Brazil. Participants from all other countries are strongly advised to contact the nearest Brazilian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa, including transit ones, in a timely manner, prior to departure. To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue **upon request** invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications. The visa application process can be lengthy, so please allow sufficient time. Some airline companies will not allow boarding without a valid visa.

7. Health information

In accordance to the World Health Organization (WHO) procedures, Brazil is listed both as a country with risk of yellow fever transmission and a country requiring yellow fever vaccination for travellers coming from countries with risk of yellow fever transmission. An International Certificate of Vaccination or Revaccination against Yellow Fever will be required upon arrival in Brazil. The WHO link is as follows:

The vaccination, valid for ten years, must have taken place at least 10 (ten) days prior to disembarkation in Brazil.

Malaria is present in most forested areas below 900m within nine states (Acre, Amapá, Amazonas, Mato Grosso, Maranhaõ, Para, Rondonia, Roraima, and Tocantins), and also occurs on the periphery of some large cities (Belem, Boa Vista, Macapa, Manaus, Maraba, Porto Velho, and Santarem). There is no recorded transmission at Iguazu Falls.

For more information or your vaccination requirements for Brazil, please consult a medical professional with regard to the vaccination requirements for your travel.

8. Hotel information

9. Field Trip

On Friday, 28 March, is a half day at the meeting followed by a field trip in the afternoon to Fibria and Suzano (which are located on the way to the airport) as examples of restoration and immediately after all delegates will be transferred to a hotel at the airport near Vitoria. Please bring appropriate clothing and footwear for an outdoor walk.

10. Payment of the Daily Subsistence Allowances (DSA)

Sponsored participants will receive the relevant portion of their DSA on the first day of the workshop.

11. Official language in Brazil

The official language in Brazil is Portuguese. English is spoken in some hotels and restaurants.

12. Weather and time zone information



In March, temperatures in the region of Linhares (near Vitoria) having a tropical rainforest climate, range between a maximum of 31°C in the daytime and a minimum of 23°C at night. Current weather conditions can be found at http://www.worldweather.org/136/c01085.htm.

The standard time zone in Brazil is GMT/ UTC -3 hours.

13. Electricity

Brazil uses two voltages: 110-127 volts and 220-240 volts. In Linhares, the voltage is 220 volts, 60 Hertz.

In general, the plugs are a two-pin type as shown in the figure below. However, it is highly recommended that participants bring their own adapters, because different types of electrical sockets are used in Brazil.





14. Currency



The Brazilian currency is the Real/Reais (R\$). The current exchange rate as at 14 March 2014 is US \$1 = R \$2.36 and \$0 = R \$3.27. Visa and MasterCard are widely accepted by establishments in Brazil. Cash and travellers checks can be exchanged in banks, travel agencies and most hotels.
