





3. Need for the Enhanced Framework for Resource Mobilization at COP12

- The 2008 (COP9) strategy for resource mobilization in support of the Convention's three objectives was designed up to 2015
- No specific resource mobilization strategy to support the implementation of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and associated targets by 2020
- Consolidation of decisions IX/11 (framework), X/3 (indicators) and XI/4 (preliminary targets)
- Need for Development of a coherent framework on resource mobilization at COP12

- **4.** Guiding Principles for COP-12(Pyeongchang) Strategy for Financial Resource Mobilization
 - Consolidating existing decisions, not lose any existing commitments
 - Balanced and integrated approach
 - Governments-led platform for developing financial resources agenda, following the Quito process
 - Providing unified voice on biodiversity financing at various forums
