☐ The Preliminary Reporting Framework

- ❖ Developed to assist Parties in providing data on Resource Mobilization using the *indicators* adopted in Decision X/3;
- ❖ Following WGRI-4, the Framework was further elaborated;
- ❖ 21 Parties responded by using it as a flexible and tentative Framework to monitor resources mobilized for BD at national and global levels:
- To provide funding information and/or give comments and feedback

Estimates of Current Biodiversity Expenditures

- ☐ Article 20
- Addresses issue of financial resources
- ❖ Should be considered in all issues related to Resource Mobilization
- **☐** Multifaceted Nature of Biodiversity (BD) Financing
- Various funding channels and multiple sectors of relevance to BD
- ❖ Drivers impacts on BD (direct, indirect, and externalities (co-costs & cobenefits)
- ❖ Often hard to identify what goes strictly to BD
- ❖ Financing in other sectors impact BD negatively or positively
- Challenges in defining the scope of BD funding.
- ☐ The Preliminary Reporting Framework is designed bearing all these and more in mind

In light of WGRI-4 recommendations and experiences using the Preliminary Reporting Framework

- □Category I: Activities which are directly related to BD and have a high level of certainty in terms of data; □Category II: Activities indirectly related to biodiversity and comparatively
- face more <u>uncertainty of data</u> in many countries at the current stage Additionally: Biodiversity funding can be accounted for in terms of
- ► International Flows (bilateral, multilateral ODA, ...) and
- Domestic Funding Sources (funding from the public sector, the private sector, non-profit...)



Information Provided through the Reporting Framework

- **□** 27 Parties responded (to report, give comments and feedbacks)
- **21 Submissions using the Reporting Framework**
- **☐** Between 2006-2010
- ❖ Average annual domestic spending on BD: \$50.35 billion US;
- ❖ Average annual international financial flows: \$3.6 billion US

- ☐ The information provided by Parties and Discussions at WGRI-4 point to the need to further simplify the Reporting Framework:
 - **❖** To facilitate reporting
 - ❖ To increase global comparability
- Revised Reporting Framework is made available along with methodological guidance



Current Availability of Funding Information

- **☐** Global information on BD financing is limited
- ➤ Global Canopy Programme estimates: BD financing was \$51-53 billion US, in 2010
- *Refers to a portion of BD financing, mostly categories A&B of the Preliminary Reporting Framework;
- ❖The bulk of BD finance is provided by national Government budgets (about 50%, or \$25.6 billion US)
- **≻OECD-DAC Rio Markers:** \$6.57 billion was targeted to BD in 2010
 - A variety of possible funding sources and mechanisms for biodiversity activities
 - ❖ Government budgets, ODA, the private sector, Philanthropy,
 - ❖ Markets, *innovative financial mechanism*, mainstreaming BD in other sectors...
 - **☐** Efforts in Scaling-up Biodiversity Finance:
 - ➤ Submission in response to para. 8 (c) of Decision X/3 including
 - **Dialogue Seminar on Scaling Up Finance for BD** (Quito, Ecuador 2012);
 - Workshop on Financing Mechanisms for BD (Montreal, Canada 2012)

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CBD Current Funding: \$6-\$10 billion - \$39.3-41.2billion/an from all sources – only less than half going to Developing countries
