5. General information on access to Cape Town, South Africa



Cape Town is serviced by the Cape Town International Airport which is approximately 50 km from the city centre. The NH Lord Charles Hotel is located approximately 30 km from the airport.

Taxis are readily available at the airport. The approximate price of the journey is 350 ZAR (approx. 44 US\$) for the first passenger and about 20 ZAR for each extra passenger; and it should take approximately 20-40 minutes.

Shuttle services are also available on demand or by pre-booking at the transfer desk in the airport arrivals hall. Schedules vary according to flight arrival times and passengers can also pre-book their return trip to the airport. Prices vary depending on the company and number of

passengers. The NH Lord Charles Hotel also offers shuttle services to and from the airport, please contact the hotel directly for more information.

6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed in **Annex A** <u>do not require</u> an entry visa for South Africa. All other participants are advised to contact the nearest South African diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. It should be noted that air lines will deny boarding in the absence of a valid visa for South Africa.

Travellers to South Africa require a yellow fever vaccination certificate for travellers over 1 year of age, who within the preceding six days, have been in or have passed through any country with risk of yellow fever transmission.

For more information, please consult a medical professional with regard to the vaccination requirements for your travel.

The currency in the South Africa in the South African Rand (ZAR). The current exchange rate as at 26 July is US \$1 = 6.68 ZAR and (Euro) $$\in 1 = 9.70$ ZAR.
