

5. General information on access to Manaus, Brazil



Manaus is serviced by the Brigadeiro Eduardo Gomes–Manaus International Airport (approximately 10 km from downtown Manaus). The Tropical Manaus Hotel is located approximately 10 km from the airport. axis are available at the airport and cost about R \$60 to the hotel.

6. Visa information



Participants from countries listed below <u>do not</u> require an entry visa for Brazil. Participants from all other countries are strongly advised to contact the nearest Brazilian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a

timely manner, prior to departure. The visa application process can be lengthy, so please allow sufficient time. Some airline companies will not allow boarding without a valid visa.

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue upon request invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications.

7. Health Requirements

Travellers to Brazil require a yellow fever vaccination certification if you have been or have passed through any country with risk of yellow fever transmission, or going to areas outside of Manaus.

Malaria is present in most forested areas below 900 m within the nine states of the "Amazonia" region and also occurs on the periphery of some large cities. Malaria prevention is recommended for Manaus.

For more information or your vaccination requirements for Brazil, please consult a medical professional with regard to the vaccination requirements for your travel.

8. Hotel information

Accommodation will be provided at the workshop venue (Tropical Manaus). Details are provided above (section 2).

Sponsored Participants:

A prepaid booking, which includes breakfast, has been made for sponsored participants. Lunch will also be provided to participants for the duration of the workshop. The hotel booking has been made according to flight itineraries.

9. Payment of the Daily Subsistence Allowances (DSA)

Sponsored participants will receive their relevant residual DSA on the first day of the meeting.

10. Official languages in Manaus, Brazil

The official language in Brazil is Portuguese. However, English and Spanish are spoken and understood in hotels and restaurants.

11. Weather and time zone information



In September, temperatures in Manaus range between a maximum of 33°C in the daytime and a minimum of 23°C at night. The rainy season is during the months from December to March. The standard time zone is GMT/UTC - 3 hours.

12. Electricity

The most common electrical currents Brazil are 127 and 220 volts, 60 Hertz. Electrical outlets, plugs and sockets are illustrated below.



The currency in Brazil is the Brazilian Real/Reais (R\$). The current exchange rate as at 15 August 2012 is US \$1.00 = R\$2.00 and \$1.00 = R\$2.48.
