5. General information on access to Nosy Be, Madagascar



Nosy Be is an island off the northwest coast of Madagascar. It is serviced by the Fascene Airport which can be is accessed via the Ivato International Airport in the capital, Antananarivo. Some direct international flights from France and Italy are also available. Taxis / transportation is available at the arrival hall at the exit of the airport and the trip to the meeting venue hotel would cost about US \$7.00 to \$10.00. Distance from the airport to the venue hotel is approximately 25 km.

6. Visa information



Participants from all countries invited require a visa to enter the Republic of Madagascar and are strongly advised to contact the nearest Malagasy diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. Please note that some airlines will not allow boarding without a valid visa. To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue upon request invitation letters to be attached to the visa applications.

10. Weather and time zone information

The standard time zone in Madagascar is GMT/ UTC +3 hours.

The electrical currents in Madagascar are 230 Volts, 50 Hertz, the plugs are as shown in the illustrations below.

The currency in Madagascar is the Malagasy Ariary (MGA). The current exchange rate as at 27 December 2015 is US $\$1 = MGA \ 3,187.00$ and $\$1.00 = MGA \ 3,496.07$ (source: www.xe.com, rates are subject to change).
