2010 BIP development objective:

a reduction in the rate of biodiversity loss at the global level, through **improved decisions** for the conservation of global biodiversity.

2010 BIP immediate objective:

that decisions made by governments and other stakeholders are **better informed** to improve the conservation status of species, habitats, and ecosystems at the global level.



The project has three key outcomes:

- (1) A 2010 Biodiversity Indicators Partnership generating information useful to decision-makers;
- (2) Improved global indicators are implemented and available;
- (3) National governments and regional organizations using and contributing to the improved delivery of global indicators.



Global-National Outputs - 1

The development of guidelines and other tools to facilitate:

- (i) the <u>use of global 2010 indicator methodologies</u> at national and regional levels,
- (ii) the <u>use of global 2010 indicators</u> in national and regionallevel policy and decision-making.
- (iii) increased local, national, and regional <u>data</u> and other <u>contributions</u> to the development of global 2010 indicators,
