- Allocation of roles and responsibilities

- Mechanisms for engagement

 - ■Face to face discussions
 - ■Telephone

Compilation

- Template
 - Request for information distributed
- First draft
 - Developed from the input from initial requests and publicly available information
- Second draft
 - ■Compilation of comments on first draft
- Final for editing
- Ministerial Approval

- Meeting deadlines
 - Other priorities emerging at crucial times in the process
 - ■Receipt of timely input from stakeholders
- Interest and involvement of stakeholders
