The new format were developed under the guidance of the SBSTTA Bureau and is intended to provide delegates with more time for scientific and technical discussions and exchanges so as to demonstrate how the available scientific information is useful in the Convention process and support Parties towards implementing the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 and the multi-year programme of work.

- Each Session will consist of panel discussions, introductory presentations and question and answer
- No Draft Recommendations prepared in advance

- Facilitating the implementation of the strategic plan for biodiversity 2011-2020 and the Aichi Biodiversity Targets
- Assessing the effects of the types of measures taken in accordance with the provisions of the convention (Strategic Goals A to D)
- Contribution of the Convention to the Intergovernmental Science-policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES)
- Progress reports by the Executive Secretary

- Scientific and Technical Needs related to the Implementation of the Strategic Plan and the Aichi Targets
- Identification and development of national biodiversity target for the Aichi Targets and the Strategic Plan
