Background to Online Reporting

- The need for monitoring implementation has been recognized in many decisions of the COP
- In decision VIII/14, the COP decided to establish a voluntary online facility to support national reporting as a planning tool
- In line with Article 18 the tool will facilitate technical cooperation among Parties by facilitating the sharing of information on the design and application of indicators and on policy support tools
- The online reporting tool is a complement to national reporting not a replacement for it and builds on it.
- The online reporting tool is part of the CHM

The online reporting tool will allow Parties to:

- Provide updates on progress towards each of their national targets and the Aichi Biodiversity Targets on an ongoing basis
- Directly submit their national biodiversity strategies and action plans and their national reports, as well other relevant documents.
- More easily identify those areas where progress is being made and those areas where more efforts may be needed

The Online reporting tool will capture information related to:


- Regional, national and subnational targets
- Indicators
- Policy support tools
- Activities.

Allows Parties to link this information to relevant Aichi Biodiversity Targets


Information entered can be viewed organized by national target or by the Aichi Biodiversity Targets.

The tool will help to identify indicator development needs, areas where more information is needed or is in need of being updated

- The online reporting tool will allow one main user to validate and publish all information.
- The main user may designate as many other authorized users as she/he wishes. These users may enter information and prepare drafts but will not be able to publish information.
- Information that is entered can be edited at any time
- Search functions and information displays are under development
