  - Poland
  - Hungary
  - Ukraine
  - Romania
  - Serbia



Limited knowledge among practitioners in PA management in the CER on the issues of participation and limited success in implementing this target

### WHY THIS ASSESSMENT?

- Stakeholder involvement is very much related to the local factors - models need to be adapted and fundamented in order to become functional for:
  - ▶ Addressing problems <u>specific</u> for the region
  - Supporting coherent strategies and action plans at regional level
  - Supporting the decision-makers chose a certain level of stakeholder involvement (co-management? government managed PAs, consultative councils?)
- Who should benefit from it?
  - Governments and decisional factors responsible for implementing PoW
  - ▶ PA Administrations improving stakeholder involvement
  - ▶ The design and development of participatory management schemes
  - Motivating political will
  - Structure knowledge that already exists
  - Facilitate change of information

## AIMS and OBJECTIVES

- Synthesize the existing theoretical information (concepts, guidelines, etc)
- Analyzes the specific enabling context in the CER for participative PA management
- Analyze current level of stakeholder involvement (at PA level)
- Offer recommendations for the development of participatory management schemes
- Assess the resources needed to achieve this target
- Identify and promote examples of success in the region
- Encourage decisional factors to adopt a more participative approach in the CER

## STEPS and OUTCOMES

### I. Collecting data and information

- Elaborate a questionnaire (a form) for collecting data at PA level semi-structured interviews at PA level
- Collect information on national context for PA governance (legislation, administrative system, etc)

### 2. The study

- At Ecoregion level recommendations for specific context and specific approach
- Preliminary assessment of costs for participative processes
- Recommendations and guidance for supporting the legislative framework (national level)
  and developing more participative processes (PA level)

# 3. The public presentation and debate phase - CNPA Committee (Jan. 2010)

- Presenting and discussing the results with the decisional factors (CNPA Committee)
- Promote models and approaches

- ▶ The project: an ambitious first step for supporting the achievement of PoW goals at regional level
- ▶ Governments and decisional factors together with the PA Administrations can benefit from it
