Please provide any general comments on the structure of the draft template for the seventh and eighth national reports, as well as the introduction to the template.

- An additional section should be added to the reporting template to report on the sections of the framework outside of the goals and targets (i.e. sections Bbis and sections H-K of the 1st draft). These sections are essential to providing an enabling environment for the goals and targets to be achieved, and assessing general country-level progress towards them could provide further insights into context and challenges in achieving the specific targets. This would mean adding questions regarding the following:
 - a. Assessment of adherence to the principles outlined in the section "Principles and Approaches [Guidance] for the implementation of the framework" (what is referred to as section "B.bis" as of the time of the submission of this report)

- b. Assessment of the status of implementation support mechanisms for the implementation of the framework (Currently Section H of the first draft)
- c. Assessment of the status of enabling conditions for the implementation of the framework (Currently Section I of the first draft)
- d. Assessment of the status of responsibility and transparency (Currently Section J of the first draft)
- e. Assessment of country-level progress made on Outreach, awareness and uptake of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework (Currently Section K of the first draft)

• Paragraph 5 of the Annex (Additions in red):

5. Further to decision 14/27, in which the Conference of the Parties decided that the submission of the next reports under the Convention and its Protocols would be synchronized, Parties should involve the respective national focal points for the Cartagena and Nagoya Protocols (if different from the primary national focal point for the Convention) in the preparation of the seventh and eighth national reports. In addition, Parties are encouraged to involve relevant rightsholders and stakeholders in the preparation of their seventh and eighth national reports. This includes representatives of indigenous peoples and local communities, women, youth, subnational governments, representatives of relevant sectors, national statistical offices, business, academia, non-governmental organizations and civil society organizations. Parties are also encouraged to involve the national focal points of the biodiversity-related conventions and the Rio conventions, in addition to the national focal points for the Sustainable Development Goals and other relevant international and regional conventions. Parties are further encouraged to use national reports, reviews or communications submitted under these conventions and in connection with the Sustainable Development Goals as an important basis for assessing progress in the implementation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework.

To ensure that the engagement and contributions of indigenous peoples and local communities, women, and youth are documented and also to encourage active involvement of these actors by Parties, we propose the following additional question under section V to reflect this: "Please describe how your country has facilitated the engagement of indigenous peoples and local communities, women, youth and relevant stakeholders in the implementation of this national target" |
