BUREAU OF THE SUBSIDIARY BODY ON SCIENTIFIC, TECHNICAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL ADVICE Kunming, China, 23-24 May 2023

MINUTES

INTRODUCTION

- 1. A meeting of the Bureau Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) was held from 23 May (2:00 5:00 p.m.) to 24 May (9:00 a.m. 12:30 p.m.) 2023, at Haigeng Convention Center, in Kunming, the People's Republic of China. The meeting was preceded by a joint meeting of the COP and SBSTTA Bureaux in the morning of 23 May 2023 and followed by another joint session of the two Bureaux in the afternoon of 24 May 2023.
- 2. The meeting was attended by the following members of the Bureau: Mr. Hesiquio Benitez Diaz (Mexico, Chair), Ms. Tia Stevens (Australia), Mr. Jan Plesnik (Czech Republic), Ms. Marina von Weissenberg (Finland), Mr. Jean Bruno Mikissa (Gabon), Mr. Gaute Voigt-Hanssen (Norway), Mr. Adams Toussaint (Saint-Lucia), Mr. Bilal Qtishat (Jordan), and Ms. Ana Teresa Lecaros Terry (Peru). Apologies were received from Ms. Gwen Sisior (Palau), Ms. Senka Barudanovic (Bosnia-Herzegovina), Ms. Marie-May Muzungaile (Seychelles) and Ms Tatsiana Lipinskaya (Belarus).
- 3. The meeting was supported by Ms. Jihyun Lee (SBSTTA Secretary) of the CBD Secretariat.

I. OPENING OF THE MEETING

- 4. The meeting was opened at 2 p.m. (local time, Kunming) on Tuesday, 23 May 2023 by the SBSTTA Chair, Mr. Hesiquio Benitez Diaz.
- 5. In his opening remarks, the SBSTTA Chair welcomed the Bureau members, expressing his appreciation for their efforts to travel to Kunming to join this meeting in- person to exchange their views and insights for the activities of the SBSTTA in the next biennium. He highlighted that there is strong commitment to move from *agreement* to *action* to build back biodiversity through the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, reiterating that the SBSTTA will need to play a critical role to make this commitment a reality. He updated the Bureau on the series of planning and coordination meetings -undertaken since the beginning of the year, including the one by the Chair with the Secretariat staff (held in February), the first online meeting of the SBSTTA Bureau (held in early March), the follow-up meetings by the Chair with the Secretariat to update on -progress in implementing various

SBSTTA-related activities (held in April), and the coordination meeting with SBI Chair (held in May), among others.

6. He also highlighted that the Secretariat has thus far this year issued 14 notifications relating to SBSTTA activities (see annex 1 to this document)), and that the SBSTTA Bureau has identified potential agenda items for both the 25th and 26th meetings of SBSTTA, and has discussed relevant preparatory activities to take place, such as peer-review, Ad Hoc Technical Expert Groups and other expert workshops/meetings, over the biennium prior to COP 16. He encouraged Bureau members to work efficiently in the next two days to reach common strategic views to guide the Secretariat, in terms of finalizing the meeting agenda of SBSTTA 25 and 26 for posting, as well as preparing- the presessional meeting documents and draft recommendations, building on the results of various intersessional activities.

II. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

- 7. The draft provisional agenda for the meeting of the SBSTTA Bureau was prepared by the SBSTTA Chair, with the support of the Secretariat, taking into account the joint Bureaux meeting with the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties being convened in conjunction with this meeting. The Bureau was invited to consider the provisional agenda for its meeting for adoption.
- 8. The Chair invited Ms. Jihyun Lee, Secretary to the SBSTTA, to introduce the agenda and guide the Bureau memers on the related meeting documents.
- 9. The Bureau members had before them: draft provisional agenda and its annotations for SBSTTA at its 25th and 26the meetings, an updated table of preparatory activities for these two meetings, the list of notifications relating to SBSTTA activities issued so far in 2023, and draft list of different agenda items to be followed-up by respective Bureau members.
- 10. The Bureau adopted the provisional agenda for its meeting without any modifications.

III. PREPARATIONS FOR THE TWENTY-FIFTH MEETING OF THE SUBSIDIARY BODY ON SCIENTIFIC, TECHNICAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL ADVICE, INCLUDING INTERSESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

- 11. Under this item, the Bureau members, with the support of the Secretariat, reviewed the draft provisional agenda and its annotations for the twenty-fifth meeting of the SBSTTA, to be held in October 2023, in Nairobi, Kenya.
- 12. The Chair, with the support of the Secretariat, provided updates to the Bureau members regarding the preparatory activities for SBSTTA 25, including the issuance of notifications, peer-review of documents, submission of information and organization of various expert processes, together with a tentative timeframe for these intersessional activities (see annex 2 to this document).
- 13. The draft provisional agenda and its annotations as well as an updated table of associated preparatory activities, together with additional supplementary information, was provided to the Bureau in advance of the meeting.
- 14. After exchanging their views and insights on the proposed agenda items for SBSTTA 25, the SBSTTA Bureau approved the provisional agenda, which includes eight agenda and sub-agenda items, as contained in annex 3 to this document; specific agenda items were identified, and the interlinkages and priorities among different agenda items were discussed.

- 15. Through extensive deliberations, the SBSTTA Bureau provided clear guidance and advice to the Secretariat in terms of finalizing the annotations to the provisional agenda for SBSTTA 25 and the organization of the work, undertaking various intersessional activities and preparing for the meeting documents.
- 16. Some of the important discussion points, which apply to the consideration of agenda items for both SBSTTA 25 and 26, are summarized as-below:
 - a) Priorities for the forthcoming SBSTTA meetings need to focus on facilitating the national implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, by providing necessary scientific and technical tools and options that will enable Parties and partners to expedite their implementation activities;
 - b) SBSTTA 25 will thus review the findings of assessments from relevant bodies, such as the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES) IPBES and the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), so that it can consolidate necessary scientific and technical recommendations relating to the implementation of the GBF to support national implementation. In this regard, the Bureau members noted the schedule of the forthcoming meeting of IPBES 10 Plenary, to be held from 28 August 2023 to 2 September 2023, in Bonn, Germany, which will consider the request from the Convention regarding a second global assessment on biodiversity and ecosystem services, as contained in annex to decision 15/19.
 - c) Both SBSTTA 25 and 26 should prioritize the finalization of the development of the monitoring framework, as requested by COP 15, building on the outcomes of the AHTEG established for this purpose. Coordination meeting(s) with the Co-Chairs of the AHTEG was proposed in this regard, including further clarification on the mandates of the AHTEG to address the gaps in the headline indicators;
 - d) SBSTTA 25 and 26 will identify scientific and technical needs to support the implementation of the GBF, including its implications for the programme of work of the Convention, through step-by-step approaches. Specifically, SBSTTA 25 will receive the results of the rapid gap analysis of relevant programmes of work in the context of KMGBF, to be undertaken by engaging Parties through webinars or peer-reviews, so that the Subsidiary Body can consider priority areas for updating some programmes of work to effectively support the implementation of the KMGBF.
 - e) Furthermore, the SBSTTA Bureau noted some challenges in undertaking the work proposed for its 25th and 26th meetings. For example:
 - SBSTTA 25 may need at least one more day for its deliberations to effectively cover all the agenda items;
 - The Bureau needs to find ways to manage the heavy agenda items for SBSTTA 26, including the consideration of possible working modalities of SBSTTA;
 - The Bureau also noted urgent needs for identifying available financial resources to support the work of undertaking strategic review and updating the relevant programmes of work in the context of the KMGBF, as well as expediting the work on biodiversity and health among others, including the use of a fund for Digital Sequence Information (DSI) provided by Norway to support the work of biodiversity and health; and

o In view of the priorities identified for both SBSTTA meetings, it was emphasized that the presession documents and draft recommendations for both SBSTTA meetings should be prepared in a concise and succint manner.

IV. PREPARATIONS FOR THE TWENTY-SIXTH MEETING OF THE SUBSIDIARY BODY ON SCIENTIFIC, TECHNICAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL ADVICE, INCLUDING INTERSESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

- 17. Under this item, the Bureau members, with the support of the Secretariat, reviewed the draft provisional agenda and its annotations for the twenty-sixth meeting of the SBSTTA, to be held in May 2024.
- 18. The Chair, with the support of the Secretariat, provided updates to the Bureau members regarding the preparatory activities for SBSTTA 26, including the issuance of notifications, peer-review of documents, submission of information and organization of various expert processes, together with a tentative timeframe for these intersessional activities (see annex 4 to this document).
- 19. The draft provisional agenda and its annotations as well as an updated table of associated preparatory activities was provided to the Bureau in advance of the meeting.
- 20. After exchanging their views and insights on the proposed agenda items for SBSTTA 26, the SBSTTA Bureau approved the provisional agenda, which includes nine agenda and sub-agenda items, as contained in annex 5 to this document, identifying specific agenda items and discussing the interlinkages and priorities among different agenda items; specific agenda items were identified, and the interlinkages and priorities among different agenda items were discussed.
- 21. Through extensive deliberations, the SBSTTA Bureau provided clear guidance and advice to the Secretariat in terms of finalizing the annotations to the provisional agenda for SBSTTA 26 and the organization of the work, undertaking various intersessional activities and preparing the meeting documents.
- 22. The discussion points summarized in the paragraph 16 above were also applied to the considerations under this agenda item.

V. OTHER MATTERS

23. Under this agenda item, the Bureau updated the list of the Bureau members to follow-up with specific agenda items, as contained in the annex 6 to this document.

VI. CLOSURE OF THE MEETING

- 24. During closing of the meeting, the Chair expressed his appreciation to all the Bureau members for their hard work to ensure the success of this meeting. He noted that the meeting discussions have been very informative and valuable to the preparations for the two upcoming SBSTTA meetings and also to ensuring that the scientific and technical needs are adequately addressed in facilitating the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework. He also thanked the Secretariat for efficiently servicing the meeting, including the timely provision of all the relevant meeting documents and supplementary information.
- 25. The Bureau meeting was closed at 12:30 p.m. (local time, Kunming) on Wednesday, 24 May 2023.
