It shows a paradigm shift of recognition of collective rights; that was impressive.</li> <li>- All sessions were useful, not only for NBSAP implementation but for the overall activities.</li> <li>- The CBD, steps on developing NBSAP, Stakeholders to be engaged, synergies between the Rio conventions.</li> <li>- NBSAP Forum is the best idea, hope that works and more country experiences and knowledge sharing will be seen in the future.</li> <li>- Exchange of experiences among all parties. <b>Is there anything that we could have done differently to enhance the usefulness of this workshop?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The workshop was successful.</li> <li>- Rather than different language group, suggestion to organize meeting based on regional groups (Africa, Asia, etc.).</li> <li>- Include interaction / dialogue with countries from other regions to share regional experiences.</li> <li>- Organize regional workshops and then global would be better.</li> <li>- Give more time to each theme. More time was needed for valuation and resource mobilization</li> <li>- In Africa, large scale mining is not a problem as long as regulated. There was no discussion. Has this been proven?</li> <li>- The GEF should be represented to update us on other opportunities.</li> <li>- Stationeries, flash memories should be provided.</li> <li>- Better preparation for group work with visualization.</li> <li>- The theme should be translated to all languages.</li> <li>- Organization of the workshop could be done in a more organized way, structured and facilitated to produce better outputs/achieve the overall objective of the workshop.</li> <li>- The demonstrating examples of national targets.</li> <li>- More country presentations, discussions, knowledge, sharing with support presentations from supporting institutions rather than other way around.</li> </ul>					

- How to value ecosystem services / a summary report from each group should be included.
- A network among the participants will enhance the usefulness of the workshop.
- Avoid using presentations from other workshops – too repetitive.
- Present / share experiences on specific subjects or bottlenecks in the implementation of the Strategic Plan
- The Secretariat could have beforehand established how far different countries are in their NBSAP review process and then organize agenda items based on that; so that everyone benefited rather than have endure repetitions.
- Side event could be filled with more organized programme.
- Case studies on resources mobilization
- Establish road-map of the levels or steps to elaborate resource mobilization strategy
