NOTIFICATION

Madam/Sir,

Re: Asia and Pacific Regional Meeting on capacity-building for the Biosafety Clearing-House (to be held back-to-back with the UNEP-GEF regional workshop on biosafety)
4-8 March 2002, Beijing, China

As you may be aware, Article 20 of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety to the Convention on Biological Diversity establishes a Biosafety Clearing-House as part of the clearing-house mechanism under Article 18, paragraph 3, of the Convention, in order to facilitate the exchange of scientific, technical, environmental and legal information on, and experience with, living modified organisms; and to assist Parties to implement the Protocol.

At the first meeting of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (ICCP), the Executive Secretary was requested to analyze the identified capacity-building and financial requirements of the developing countries, in particular the least developed and small island developing states among them, and countries with economies in transition, as well as countries that are centres of origin and centres of genetic diversity, to enable their active participation in the pilot phase of the Biosafety Clearing-House. In support of this objective, a regional meeting will be convened for the Asia and Pacific States, in Beijing, China, with the generous support of the Governments of the United States of America and the United Kingdom, and following the kind offer of the Government of China to host such a meeting, to provide countries of the region with an opportunity to express their needs and expectations with regard to the establishment of the pilot phase, and also to provide training on the use of the Biosafety Clearing-House.

This regional meeting will be held jointly with the UNEP-GEF regional workshop on biosafety, which will focus on increasing awareness of the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety and on the development of national biosafety frameworks in the countries of the region. These meetings will be held from <u>4 to 8</u> <u>March 2002</u>. According to the draft provisional agenda, it is envisioned that 4 March will be a joint introductory day, 5 to 6 March will focus on national biosafety frameworks, and 7 to 8 March will focus on the Biosafety Clearing-House.

Each Asia and Pacific country Party to the Convention will have the opportunity to send two participants to the two meetings: one to be supported by the CBD Secretariat and one to be supported by
