NOTIFICATION

Establishment of an advisory group/steering committee to assist in the completion of the composite report and undertake peer review of the revised version (Decision VII/16/E/4(d) on Article 8(j) and related provisions).

Dear Sir/Madam,

In its decision VII/16E, paragraph 4(d) on the composite report on the status and trends regarding traditional knowledge relevant to biological diversity, the Conference of the Parties requested the Executive Secretary to "create an advisory group/steering committee in which indigenous and local communities will be represented to assist in the completion of the report and undertake a peer review of the revised version, in consultation with indigenous peoples and local community organizations that have participated in the work on the Convention"

In Notification Ref: SCBD/SEL/OJ/RR/43986 dated 15 June 2004, the Secretariat invited nominations for the Advisory Group. After due consideration, taking into account the nominees' expertise and experience in indigenous issues and traditional knowledge as well as geographic distribution and gender balance, I am pleased to inform you that the advisory group for Article 8(j) has been established. A list of members is contained in Annex I and a list of all nominations is contained in Annex II.

It is envisaged that the advisory group will meet physically together in 2005. However, most communications and discussions will occur via electronic means. While the main task of the advisory group will be to assist in and undertake a peer review of the composite report as decided by the Conference of the Parties, the Group will be called upon to provide advice on other, related matters, such as the further development of a plan of action for the retention of traditional knowledge relevant for the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity, consistent with decision VII E, paragraph 8.

With regard to the composite report, Advisory Group members may be called upon to participate in the regional workshops (as per Decision VII/16, E.4 [a]) to be organized to assist the consultants in drafting the report and to encourage input from Parties, Governments, relevant organizations and all stakeholders as appropriate, including indigenous and local communities.
