Invitation to complete a survey to evaluate the effectiveness of capacity-building activities supported and facilitated by the Secretariat

In its decision XII/2B paragraph 8(d), the Conference of the Parties requested the Executive Secretary, *inter alia*, to undertake an evaluation of the effectiveness of capacity-building activities that the Secretariat has supported and facilitated, including recommendations on how to further integrate the needs expressed by Parties using participatory approaches.

In addressing this decision, the Secretariat is conducting a survey of National Focal Points and participants (including government officials and representatives of indigenous peoples and local communities) who have taken part in capacity building activities it has facilitated and/or supported during the period $2013-2015^{1}$.
