NOTIFICATION

Risk Assessment and Risk Management under the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety: submission of information and call for expression of interest

Dear Madam/Sir,

In <u>decision CP-9/13</u>, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (COP-MOP) decided to establish a process for the identification and prioritization of specific issues regarding risk assessment of living modified organisms. It also decided to consider at its tenth meeting, whether additional guidance materials on risk assessment are needed for (a) living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives, and (b) living modified fish.

The process agreed to in decision CP-9/13 entails the submission of views, the commissioning of studies, discussions through an online forum, work by an ad hoc technical expert group (AHTEG), consideration of the outcomes by the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA), and recommendations by the SBSTTA to the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol.

The table below presents a tentative timeline for the implementation of the activities foreseen as part of this process.

Submission of information

Pursuant to paragraph 10 of decision CP-9/13, I am pleased to invite Parties, other Governments, indigenous peoples and local communities, and relevant organizations to submit information relevant to the work of the online forum and the AHTEG.

The online forum will assist the AHTEG in the following tasks:

- Review the commissioned studies and perform an analysis on living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives and living modified fish according to annex I of decision CP-9/13, and supported by the data in the studies;
- Consider the needs and priorities for further guidance and gaps in existing guidance;
- Make recommendations on (i) the need for guidance to be developed on risk assessment of living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives and living modified fish; and (ii) any adjustments to annex I of decision CP-9/13.

Accordingly, Parties and observers may wish to submit information related to:

- a) Experience in undertaking risk assessment of living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives and living modified fish (detailing how and for which cases); or else, lack of experience in doing so;
- b) Challenges experienced or foreseen in undertaking risk assessment of living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives and living modified fish;
- c) Specific needs (if any) to properly undertake risk assessment of living modified organisms containing engineered gene drives.

Kindly submit your information as soon as possible but **no later than 15 March 2019**. Please note that submissions should be sent through an official letter addressed to the Executive Secretary by e-mail to secretariat@cbd.int.

The information submitted will be made available for consideration by the online forum and the AHTEG.
