### Peer review of the study on financial security (Article 10 of the Nagoya – Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress)

Dear Madam/Sir,

Article 10 of the Nagoya – Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress and decision [CP-9/15](#) requested the Secretariat to commission a study on financial security mechanisms addressing: (a) the modalities of financial security mechanisms; (b) an assessment of the environmental, economic and social impacts of such mechanisms, in particular on developing countries; and (c) an identification of the appropriate entities to provide financial security. Using funds available in the voluntary trust fund, the Secretariat has commissioned a consultant to undertake the study.
