Composition of the Informal Advisory Committee on Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA-IAC)

Dear Sir or Madam,

Through its [decision VII/24](#), the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the Convention established an Informal Advisory Committee (IAC) to provide guidance on the development and implementation of the programme of work on Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA). The mandate of the CEPA-IAC was further strengthened by [decision 16/10](#), which requests the Secretariat to implement, in consultation with the CEPA-IAC, the suggested actions to align the programme of work on CEPA with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (KMGBF).

In this connection, through [notification 2025-147](#), a call for nominations was made for participation to the Informal Advisory Committee on Communication, Education and Public Awareness for the biennium 2026–2027. In response to this invitation, a total of 47 nominations were received, including 22 from Parties and 25 from observers, which comprised representatives of indigenous peoples and local communities, international and regional organizations, and academic and scientific institutions, women and youth. From these nominations, 25 members were selected, including 13 members from Parties and 12 members from observers, based on their expertise and experience, while ensuring equitable geographic representation and gender balance. A slightly lower number of members was selected from the Asia-Pacific and Eastern European States due to the limited number of nominations received from those regions.

I am pleased to convey, for your information, the composition of the Informal Advisory Committee on Communication, Education and Public Awareness (CEPA-IAC) for the biennium 2026–2027, as set out in the annex to the present notification.

In line with decision [16/10](#), the CEPA-IAC will provide advice to the Executive Secretary on strategic approaches, themes, and background materials to support Parties, relevant organizations, and indigenous peoples and local communities in implementing CEPA actions aligned with the KMGBF.
