# ACTION TO BE TAKEN INTER-SESSIONALLY BY DONOR COUNTRIES

The Intergovernmental Committee for the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety

## Recommendation 3/3. Information-sharing

## Item 4.1.3: Information-sharing

6. Recognizes the importance of developing a fully functioning Biosafety Clearing-House by the time of entry into force of the Protocol, and of meeting the capacity needs of all countries with respect to implementation and use of the Biosafety Clearing-House, and invites developed country Governments and other donors to provide financial support to ensure that, where appropriate, these recommendations and those contained in the third note of the Bureau can be implemented, including the continuing development of regional activities and of essential tools and required equipment, such as the tool kit and the templates to assist countries to develop their own national databases that are interoperable with the Biosafety Clearing-House;

### Recommendation 3/5. Capacity-building (Article 22 and Article 28, paragraph 3)

# <u>Item 4.1.4:</u> Capacity-building (Roster of Experts)

8. *Urges* Governments and other donors to make contributions to the pilot phase of the voluntary fund (to facilitate the use of the roster of experts by developing countries and countries with economies in transition, Parties to the Protocol).

# <u>Item 4.1.4:</u> Capacity-building (Article 22 and Article 28, paragraph 3)

- 3. *Invites* developed country Parties and other donors to make voluntary financial contributions to the Secretariat to facilitate implementation of the Coordination Mechanism;
- 6 Requests developed country Parties, donors and relevant organisations to provide assistance to developing countries, in particular the least developed and the small island developing States among them, and Parties with economies in transition, to organize workshops on capacity-building;
