## **Procestry Connecting Countries**

- 6 Regional Forestry Commissions
  - First one created in 1948
- Intergovernmental (part of UN/FAO)
- Address policy and technical issues
- Guided by their Executive Committees, facilitated by FAO
- Attended by Heads of Forestry
  - Increasing participation of other stakeholders
- Report to Committee on Forestry (COFO)
- Link with other global fora


### Forestry Key items in 2008

- Sustainable forest management
  - forests in a changing environment
- Forests & climate change, bioenergy
- Forests & poverty
- Invasive species
- National forest programmes, law compliance



#### Forestry New features in 2008

- Regional forestry weeks (Asia & Europe)
- Broader linkages between RFCs and global dialogues (COFO, UNFF, UNFCCC, CBD...)
- Increasing intersessional activities
  - networks, working groups, think-tanks & policy fora on key issues





#### **RFC & biodiversity**

Biodiversity considerations are part of many forestry activities (examples):

- Voluntary guidelines on harvesting, planted forests, fire, arid & semi-arid forestry
  - all address better management practices including environmental aspects
- Regional networks on invasive species
  - Asia-Pacific, Africa, Near East
- Network on Protected Areas (REDPARQUES)



#### ...RFC & biodiversity

(examples cont'd):

- In search of excellence initiatives
  - collection of best management practices in West Africa, Asia & Latin America
- Special emphasis on protected areas and wildlife in Africa
  - wildlife for food security
  - Human wildlife conflicts
  - Forest & Fauna magazine: special article on "Value of biodiversity"




#### In conclusion
