- ·Information on FNA is available for only 19 countries
- Estimated annual funding gap in these countries ranged from Us \$ 3.28 to 142.25 million

- ·A wide range of IFM exist with potential to raise PA financing
- ·Need for diversified financial portfolio of both traditional and IFM
- ·Sound financial planning, improved financial management capacity, transparency and accountability.

- 3.2.3 Public-Private Partnerships
- ·PPP in the sectors of ecotourism, watershed services offer for improving economic sustainability of PAs and efficiently leveraging investment
