




## Report of the China Biodiversity Conservation of Green Development Foundation on the International Day for Biological Diversity 2022

### 1. International Biodiversity Summit

In support of the big day, China Biodiversity Conservation and Green Development Foundation (CBCGDF) organized a grand preparatory meeting from May 22 to 23, 2022, to welcome the upcoming CBD COP15 in Kunming and its Fourth meeting of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework to be held in Nairobi.

This Summit aims to become a celebration on the annual May 22 Biodiversity Day by the scientific community, which is a unique opportunity to welcome the Fourth meeting of the Open-ended Working Group on the Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework and the second phase of CBD COP15. The Summit included four sessions: Genetic Biodiversity and Digital Genetic Sequences, Illegal wildlife Trade, Soil and Agricultural Biodiversity, Wetland and Ecological Restoration.



The first day of the conference was about Illegal wildlife Trade, Genetic Biodiversity and Digital Genetic Sequences, and the second day about Soil & Agricultural Biodiversity, and Wetland & Ecological Restoration. Nearly 20 experts participated in the two-day meeting, and the experts shared in-depth information from their own fields, making biodiversity conservation well known and valued by more people from various fields.



## A proposed model-sharing strategy in global governance for DSI

- With the booming development of emerging biotechnologies, the digital sequencing information (DSI) contained in animals, plants and microorganisms become valuable. The global sharing of DSI is important in ensuring the global good security and contributing to the biodiversity conservation.
- Although the benefits of global sharing of DSI is obvious, it suffers obstacles in practice. Different countries have divergent views on the cross-border access of DSI.
- On one hand, many developed countries with high-level biotechnology capability stand for the open access of DSI without the promise of benefit-sharing.
- On the other hand, many developing countries with abundant genetic resources prefer more conservative policies to restrict the trans-border access of DSI. International organizations like CBD, FAO, WIPO have launched multilateral dialogues in addressing this problem, but no substantive consensus has been achieved yet.





## 2. 2022 Science and Technology Week in Lijiang City, Yunnan: Conservation of Alpine Plant Species in Northwest Yunnan

On May 22, a total of 145 teachers and students from Lijiang Teachers College came to Lijiang Alpine Botanical Garden, Kunming Institute of Botany, Chinese Academy of Sciences to carry out the International Biodiversity Day activities.

All teachers and students at the Lijiang Alpine Botanical Garden jointly called for the 2022 International Biodiversity Theme: Building a shared future for all life. Afterwards, teachers and students divided into several groups set out for the botanical garden. Along the way, teachers explained the characteristics of alpine plant diversity, the development orientation and ecological function of Lijiang Alpine Botanical Garden. By touching and collecting alpine plant

specimens, the students learned how to collect, press and trim plant specimens in the wild, and through the teachers' description of the morphological characteristics of wild plants, they learned the rapid identification technology of wild plants, and further understood the diversity of alpine plants. This activity allowed more students to understand the importance of biodiversity and the importance of alpine plant diversity.



### **3. Chizhou City, Anhui Province: Join Hands with Young People to Protect the Beauty of Biodiversity**

To popularize the knowledge of biodiversity to the primary school students, Wang Shi from CBCGDF Community Conservation Area of Tundra Swans at Moon Lake in Chizhou, Anhui (among more than 180 CCAfas across China) had a lecture for the children about how to protect birds and biodiversity. Through his detailed explanation, the children benefited a lot and said they would take action to care for birds and participate in biodiversity conservation.

## 6. Instant Bird Rescue and Diligent Care from CBCGDF Volunteers to Support the day

On May 22, International Biodiversity Day, Mr. Hong, director of CBCGDF Community Conservation Area in Shijiazhuang, Hebei, rescued two egrets that were found injured in their breeding habitat during his daily patrol, one adult and one young. He brought both of them back to the wildlife rescue station.

"The adult egret was unable to stand or fly normally when it was found. It's breeding season now, and it already had beautiful feathers on its head. And the young one, might drop from the nest. We had to help it since young bird cannot survive without the care of its parents." According to Mr. Hong. Both birds are now in perfect condition with good appetites under diligent care of our volunteers.
