Clearly identify the Gaps for the elements.

# PRIORITIES IDENTIFIED FOR THE REGION (The establishment of Activities in relation to identified commitments and opportunities).

In this section, we will describe the Activities of our action plan. What needs to be achieved based on previous discussion and identifications on gaps, commitments and opportunities? The actions must be very specific and precise (not generic). It must detail How is involved? Where are the actions located? What resources will we need? And what are the possible barriers and how to overcome them?

The Activities must be measurable: How many countries? How many Protected Areas?, How many km²?In what percentage?

Activities must be achievable by JULY 2020. So only include those actions, commitments and opportunities that are already in the pipeline or realistic to occur.


