**ACCESS AND
BENEFIT-SHARING**

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Goal C. The benefits from the utilization of genetic resources are shared fairly and equitably, with a substantial increase in both monetary and non-monetary benefits shared, including for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity

Objective:

The fair and equitable sharing of benefits from the utilization of genetic resources is one of the three objectives of the Convention on Biological Diversity and the primary objective of the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization. Benefits generated from the access to and use of genetic resources and/or associated traditional knowledge can contribute to the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity and can supplement the financial resources required for implementing the 2050 Vision. However, it should be noted that the benefits generated can take various forms, i.e. monetary or non-monetary.
